12. According to John 6:37, 100 (-5)% of those that the Father gives to Jesus come to Him, and 0 (-5)% are cast out.

Justified by works means declared righteous by good works. Good works do not save anyone ... faith does. True faith produces good works (a 2 Corinthians 13:5 test) ... but good works do not produce salvation.
